As Leader and Chair of the Community Achievement Awards Working Group, Petrina felt honoured to be asked to celebrate those heroes in our district who have volunteered hundreds of hours of their time.

Cllr Asker presented the awards and Petrina as Chair of the Committee who decides the awards was delighted to address the gathering. We are extremely fortunate to have so many people in Uttlesford who give up their time for others. This awards event is important as it highlights what a vital contribution volunteers make to our lives every day and the value they bring to their communities is inspirational. This list included the Henham Dragon Editorial team, nominated by Henham Parish Council. It was wonderful to share the evening with them (even if they are extremely strict with me regarding time contribution)! A well-deserved accolade. It would be wonderful if Elsenham folk could think of those that they know are eligible (I know loads in this village) and help Elsenham Parish Council nominate our local heroes next year!

There is good news regarding the five years' housing land supply values which are relevant under the NPPF, as it currently stands. This is linked to a "presumption in favour of sustainable development" which is applicable unless five years' supply can be demonstrated. The updated value of 4.89 years as of 1 April 2022 has been published recently. We have noted that planning applicants that have submitted applications recently are still referring to the prior data, but the UDC Development Management team are, we understand, including on the planning application portal the updated position so that any reader can familiarise themselves with the accurate position. Applicants are still using UDC for their planning decisions and we will continue to refuse if we feel it is not the right development. Of course, the appeal route is still available.

Disappointingly and without consultation we were informed that the ECC-funded Highways Rangers Service will end in April this year. As we were unable to secure additional funding for this valued service, we will see the redeployment of the Highways Rangers staff into other roles within UDC.

Despite reporting, potholes repairs are not being addressed in this village. Please email Petrina at her Council address to report Elsenham potholes and she will collate and send to the appropriate cabinet member in one block.

Thank you for all your foodbank donations, those Christmas parcels helped many families. To help with the cost-of-living crisis, we have a dedicated page at www.uttlesford.gov.uk/cost-of-living.

### **ELSENHAM PARISH COUNCIL JANUARY 2023**

The clothes bank in the playing field has raised £164. It was agreed to give this money to Touchpoint. Touchpoint has opened in Elsenham 18 times, with an average of 70 people attending. Approximately 6.5 tons of food has been distributed, food that would otherwise have gone to land fill.

During the recent cold weather, the playing field car park became very icy and dangerous. It was agreed to purchase a new grit bin to be placed near the bottom car park, so that the salt would be easily assessible in further icy weather.

The Parish Council set a precept of  $\pounds$ 85,500 for the financial year 2023/2024. This precept equates to an increase to a band D household of  $\pounds$ 0.85p per year. The Chairman and the Parish Clerk signed the 'Precept upon Charging Authority'.

It had been agreed that the Parish Council would purchase a memorial tablet to the late Queen Elizabeth II, which would be placed in the Memorial Garden. The tablet will be in Balmoral Granite Finish, the inscription will read.

#### In Memory of HM Queen Elizabeth II 21st April 1926 - 8th September 2022.

ECC have increased their council tax by 3.5%. Essex has some very deprived areas, so ECC was keen to keep an increase as low as possible. 2% of the increase is going on Social Services, which covers things like mental health, dementia, autism, accessible transport and end of life care, although this is a very small majority of residents in Essex these services are vital.

Our County Councillor Ray Gooding is writing a letter to Essex Waste regarding the HGV lorries using the roads around the village to transport spoil from development sites in Bishop's Stortford North to locations in Essex. These lorries are using Grove Hill where they breach the weight limit and going through Ugley Green where they breach the width limit. Essex legal department will check the letter before it is sent.

The Parish Council agreed that Cllr. Gooding may cite Elsenham village as having great concerns about these HGVs. Cllr. Johnson asked Cllr. Gooding when the dangerous potholes on Hall Road near Abbotsford Bridge and Station Road were going to be repaired. To avoid the potholes drivers are swerving onto the other side of the road, which is very dangerous especially in Hall Road, which is a narrow road with blind bends. Cllr. Gooding said that the potholes in these roads had been reported to Essex County Council and had been placed on the list to be repaired. Cllr. Johnson said he hoped the repairs would be carried out soon before anyone was injured.

The next Parish Council meeting will be on Monday 6 February at 8pm in the Memorial Hall. All residents are welcome.

### **DEVELOPMENT DEVELOPMENTS**

Just in case you have forgotten over the break, developers of major housing schemes in Uttlesford now have the option of applying directly to the Planning Inspectorate (PINS). Under these provisions, the first hearing relating to our area was held on 12 December and concerned Bloor Homes' application for another 200 homes adjacent to the 350 off Henham Road, which are now noisily under construction. The format for the hearing is something of a hybrid between an application before Uttlesford District Council's Planning Committee (limited time for speakers, no cross-examination) and an Appeal before PINS (determination by a single inspector, one item on the agenda, decision released later).

The site is in Henham parish. Their Parish Council engaged a planning consultant and a traffic consultant, who made a good case in the limited time available. Henham was also represented by a doughty district councillor who presented many personal testimonies regarding the problems of access through Grove Hill. Elsenham was represented by a persistent parish councillor, who implored the inspector to bear in mind the large amount of housing approved but not yet delivered. UDC's representation was weak to the point of woeful, so much so that, in what was probably a personal first, I actually found myself sympathising with the applicants when they complained about UDC's lack of engagement over a draft S106 agreement. The great, the overwhelming, problem is that UDC does not have a Local Plan, which greatly favours developers.

Everything favours developers, really. They can appeal, for instance, if a decision of UDC's Planning Committee goes against them, whereas there is no appeal if the decision is in their favour. An application for 50 homes to the south of Bedwell Road was refused in July on the grounds of noise and air pollution from the motorway. The owners of the site put in an appeal not long before the expiry of the six-month deadline. Through the vagaries of the parish boundary the site is in Ugley parish, but it is generally accepted that the major impact would be on Elsenham. Ugley parish lacks Elsenham's extensive, if unwelcome, experience of planning applications; the two parishes combined to oppose the application and are likely to do so again.

Noise is an issue concerning the application to build 99 homes split between land off Isabel Drive and off Stansted Road, claimed to be one site in two 'parcels' because there is a path between them through Alsa Wood. It was on the Agenda for UDC's Planning Committee as long ago as 28 September but was pulled at the last minute, apparently through difficulties in satisfying the condition concerning noise. Dandara have tweaked the layout, putting some houses a bit further from the motorway by moving them to the other side of perimeter roads.

"A happy new year" to all our readers. And "Well done and keep up the good work!" to the editorial team and all those who help to keep the *Elsenham News* show on the road.

Do keep an eye on our Facebook page for updates and to see what is going on, particularly for our half-term shenanigans!



A little while before Christmas, I had an interesting telephone call from an Andrew Horsford, my note of the call was a little scrawled and I'm not sure I recorded the surname correctly. My apologies if I have got it wrong.

Andrew said he remembers years ago talking to the "old boys" in the village about a stick of bombs that were dropped across Hall Road and the Croake during the war and failed to explode. It is said they were incorrectly armed when loaded on the aircraft. Bomb disposal came along and defused the four that dropped on Hall Road but were unable to find the two that landed on the Croake.

They said that the bombs had gone deep into the sand under the meadow and were lost. Bomb Disposal were to come back with better gear to locate the bombs saying they would be unlikely to explode as the meadow was only frequented by cattle. Bomb Disposal never did return so it might appear that the bombs still lie under the Croake.

A bit of a mystery then. In our archive we have a copy of a contemporary map drawn by William Butters, known as 'Buff', who was a Special Constable during the war, showing where the various bombs. had dropped around the village,. This supports the dropping of a string of bombs in the vicinity of the Croake but doesn't explain what happened to them.

For the peace of mind of residents around the Croake, I can report that further research revealed the existence of a document called the U.X. (Unexploded) Bombs Lists of Enemy, British & Allied Incidents. A bit of a mouthful but in effect a record of all unexploded bombs dropped on the UK. There is no record of any unexploded bombs in Elsenham, all dropped ordnance having been accounted for. The nearest reported was SE of Orford House and the report was subsequently discredited in May 1953; i.e. no bombs found.

My thanks to Chris Bush, the Gordon Barker archive, Robert Bayley and others for information in this article.

Our next meeting will take place on Wednesday 8 March and will include our AGM.

Nearly 200 years ago, a new parish was carved out of the Scottish city of Dundee. The first minister of this brand new church – St Peter's Dundee – was a man called Robert Murray M'Cheyne. He was just 23 years old.

He preached and taught the Bible, he prayed, he visited, he innovated – pioneering a weekly prayer meeting in the church and always encouraging his congregation to pray and look for revival. He supported or set up many social and missionary projects – but had a particular concern for the Jewish people of Palestine.

In 1839, he travelled there with a delegation to see what could be done to assist the Jewish people. While he was away, news reached him that in his absence a great revival was breaking out at St Peter's.

Revival has been described as, 'A special work of God and especially his Holy Spirit by which Christians are renewed, quickened and stirred to pray and to share their faith. The Bible is always central and its preaching leads to conviction of sin and conversion.'

An eyewitness to the Dundee revival wrote: The forge became nothing to the blacksmith, nor the bench to the carpenter, nor the furrow to the ploughman.

They left everything to crowd the churches and the prayer meetings. There were nightly sermons in every church, household meetings for prayer in every street, twos and threes in earnest conversation on every road, and single wrestlers with God in the field and glen.

After M'Cheyne's return, the revival continued, but he himself had never enjoyed great physical health. Weakened and overworked, he contracted typhus fever and died suddenly aged just 29.

A crowd of 6,000 attended his funeral as he was buried in the graveyard at St Peter's. He had a thoroughly biblical ministry and many of his writings are still in print. But his most enduring legacy is the M'Cheyne Daily Bible Reading Plan devised to enable the whole Bible to be read in a year.

He knew there were dangers to this such as formality and dry, careless reading. But he saw great benefits in cultivating the daily discipline of reading through the whole Bible in an orderly manner without passing over some parts.

The original plan takes the user through the whole Bible with the Psalms and four Gospels twice. This means four Bible chapters a day, seven days a week, 52 weeks of the year. I've done it before. One member of my family completed it in 2022, and I have decided that 2023 is the year for me to revisit it.

Like any disciplined activity, it takes a bit of effort but I remember being surprised what little burden I found it and how helpful it was (but ask me again in 6 months!). The plan and its various adaptations are easily available online (just search M'Cheyne Daily Bible Reading Plan) and you can start on any day of the year.

#### THE BIG FREEZE OF 1962-63

The big freeze started on Boxing Day in 1962, when snow began to fall. The freezing conditions didn't relent for 10 weeks, marking the coldest recorded winter in the country since 1739, a year when temperatures plummeted to minus 22 degrees.

At the end of December 1962-63 a blizzard swept across south west England and Wales. It soon affected the South East regions and Elsenham was not spared. Nobody realised that snowmen built in the early part of January would still be around in February. Where you now can find the road from Isabel Drive at the

junction with the main road a massive snow drift formed. At that time there were just large fields, where newly built estates have been created. The falling snow was blown into the road.

The main road proved impassable for a couple of days, so walking to Elsenham Primary School was out of the question. The school had to close for a few days anyway. Water pipes and the outdoor "privy" toilets had frozen solid. When I eventually returned to school life



my mother half walked, half-carried me down the road as the snow easily covered my wellingtons.



The snowiest snow we had ever seen. Where there had been ugliness, suddenly there was beauty, all imperfection wiped smooth. Rare climatic changes led to this extreme weather. It is not out of the question we could end up with another winter as cold as the one in 1963.

#### The Start of Spring?

It's official, February 2022 was the wettest on record, no wonder its old name was February Fill Dyke. Until last year though, as well as rain we used to get hard frosts, snow and, usually, two named storms, floods and mild patches.

All last year we had "funny" weather and a very warm Autumn, despite that cold week, and a fairly warm mid-winter. This may well have brought on early flowers, to the extent that in January we had yellow dangling hazel catkins with a few left for this month, together with aconites that are past their best. Snowdrops and crocuses will be out in gardens with yellow celandines and coltsfoot decorating verges and the pale yellow primroses already coming out, unless of course we get a 10 day frost. A visit to Anglesey Abbey, a National Trust property, before the end of the month, especially for the walk through the Winter Garden followed by a stroll in the park to see the thousands of snowdrops, can be rewarding.

It is also said that February 14 is the birds' "Wedding Day" so there are some indicators that the nesting season is on the way. For instance great tits are calling their "teecher, teecher, teecherr" song letting all know their intentions. Sparrows will be checking out our row of nest boxes up on the wall, the two robins in the front will not squabble but will be feeding close to each other and male dunnocks will be singing and doing much "wing-waving" at rivals so as to claim territory. Mrs Blackbird has a beak full of grasses for lining purposes and the rook breaks off a twig and flies off towards the nest site. The wood pigeons court; he walks close behind her, bowing as he goes, until she flies off either to somewhere more private or as far away as she can get from him.

Some of our winter visitors will not breed here but are still in residence - unless of course it gets too warm for them. I don't expect to see any more redwings in our back garden as, together with some help from blackbirds, they finished off all the holly berries and the few remaining rowan berries and then moved on to another garden in Station Road. They are about the same size as our song thrush and they have a fairly similar plumage with an added orange/red "armpit" on their spotted chests and a broad cream eye stripe. Unlike our resident thrushes they move around in flocks, small or large, as do fieldfares. The latter are about as big as our mistle thrushes but their plumage has a wonderful mixture of silvery grey, chestnut brown and yellowy buff. Although they feed in flocks there has been one around the village in recent years who goes for the rotting pears on DeMandeville Green and also in our back garden. I've dubbed him "The Lone Ranger" but this year he is yet to turn up. Otherwise these two species may be off in the fields around the village on grass or crops and off to their summer grounds at the end of March. But as last year is now officially recorded as our warmest yet, who knows for next year?



Flowering snowdrops are a welcome sight in early February. Although not native to this country, these spring-flowering bulbs were planted in churchyards from the 16th century onwards. As their seeds are dispersed by ants, they have become naturalised in suitable locations such as hedgerows. Snowdrops carpet parts of Hatfield Forest and the gardens of Audley End and Easton Lodge where visitors can admire them; smaller clusters will be present in most of the churchyards around the Hundred Parishes.

Snowdrops are easily seen, but other early spring flowers will follow them as the days lengthen. Yellow-flowered primroses, winter aconites and lesser celandines

appear alongside sweet violets. All these flowers produce pollen and nectar, vital food for earlyforaging honeybees, queen bumblebees and other insects. Surveys of churchyards indicate they can be havens for wildflowers often supporting species which have become rare in the wider countryside.

Whilst neatly mown grass is appreciated by many, leaving vegetation uncut allows many attractive grassland plants to flower for the benefit of insects.

The Botanical Society of Britain and Ireland organises a wildflower hunt to record what is in flower at the start of the year. The aim is to record how flowers are responding to a warming climate. Enthusiasts search their local area, noting what is in flower. This year, the number of species recorded within the Hundred Parishes was much reduced, almost certainly due to the wintry weather experienced in December.

> More flowers will bloom as spring advances, so I encourage you to enjoy one or more of the walks or open gardens listed on <u>www.hundredparishes.org.uk</u> - or visit your local churchyard. If you are able, take some photos of what is in flower to share with friends or family or post them on Facebook, perhaps on The Hundred Parishes Facebook group.

The Hundred Parishes is 450 square miles of northwest Essex, northeast Hertfordshire and southern Cambridgeshire that is largely unspoilt and is richly endowed with many fine examples of agricultural and built heritage The area has shared a common history which shaped and preserved its distinctive landscape of small and medium-sized farms linked by winding lanes and ancient rights of way to hamlets, villages and then to small market towns. 

## **COOKERY CORNER**

The delightful colour of this tropically flavoured soup not only brings taste and cheer, but it will also warm you up on a cold wintry day.

#### SWEET POTATO AND RED PEPPER SOUP WITH COCONUT (serves 4)

1oz (25g) butter
1 onion, chopped
1 garlic clove, crushed
1 tablespoon ground coriander
1lb (450g) sweet potato, grated
2 red peppers, chopped
1¼ pints (700ml) vegetable stock
400g can coconut milk

Melt the butter in a large pan. Add the onion and garlic and cook over a low heat until soft.

Stir in the ground coriander and cook for 2 minutes.

Add the sweet potato and red peppers to the pan and cook for 5 minutes.

Pour over the vegetable stock and bring to the boil. Cover and simmer for 20 minutes.

Allow to cool a little and then blend until smooth.

Return to the rinsed-out pan and add the coconut milk. Heat gently until piping hot and serve.

#### CHEF'S RECOMMENATIONS:

If you have a food processor, use it to grate the sweet potato before cooking. You can also use your processor to blend or puree the soup once it is cooked. Try  $3\frac{1}{2}$  oz (100g) creamed coconut, chopped, in place of the can of coconut milk, just add an extra  $\frac{1}{4}$  pint (150ml) vegetable stock. Any left-over uncooked sweet potato can be cut into skinny chips and cooked in the oven alongside your favourite roast.
