### TERRY ROSAMOND


It is with great sadness that we pass on the news that Terry Rosamond recently passed away.



The rate of infections of Covid-19 has increased in Uttlesford and is presently the highest in Essex. It is increasing through transmission within the community as there is no evidence which attributes these cases to a particular event, area or outbreak. If cases appear in this way across a district, it makes it much more difficult to manage, contain and prevent further spread. Please remember to follow the Government guidelines, handwashing, social distancing and wearing a face covering.

The village is incredibly lucky to have such dedicated litter pickers who keep our village litter free. However, there has recently been an increasing number of facemasks just dropped on the ground, this not only makes the village look untidy, but it is unhygienic for litter pickers to have to pick them up. Please dispose of your facemasks in the litter bins around the village or take them home.

North Hall Road closure has been extended for a further six months. The banks of the river need to be structurally contained and the entire road needs to be rebuilt. Highways are looking into a diversionary route to avoid Grove Hill, Ugley Green and Patmore End.

Since lockdown there has been an increase in reports of child domestic violence across the county. Essex County Council is trying to recruit more foster parents to help with these children.

The winter planting in all the flowerbeds around the village took place on 20 October 2020. As in previous years the begonias and geraniums, that are currently in the flower beds, were offered to residents.

A big 'thank you' goes to Annie Gleeson, who since the retirement of two of our councillors has taken over updating the Parish Council's website.

Sadly, the usual acts of remembrance at the Memorial Gardens cannot be held this year. St. Mary's Church, and Parish Council, however, are encouraging organisations to lay wreaths at the Memorial Cross in the Memorial Garden. The Parish Council is purchasing a poppy wreath which will be laid by one of the councillors. If you are able to give a donation to the British Legion this year, it would be very appreciated as they will not be able to have the normal door to door poppy day appeal as in past years.

The next Parish Council meeting is to be held via zoom on Monday 2 November 2020 at 8pm. Members of the public are welcome, if you wish to join the meeting please look at the Parish Council website for joining instructions.

# DISTRICT COUNCILLORS' REPORT SEPTEMBER 2020

There is a lot of talk behind the scenes about a Government White Paper coming out for consultation. It is regarding proposals to abolish county and district councils and replace them with mid-sized 'unitary' councils, with an elected mayor at county level (despite the county not existing any more). To throw in a bit more, they intend to increase the new housing requirement on Uttlesford from 14,000 to about 22,000 houses, which would be the equivalent of building about three Saffron Waldens. If control over housing permissions is largely removed from councils (whichever council that might be) and left in the hands of landowners and developers, it is unclear whether mandated requirements would have any significance if there is no body with the power to implement them.

Local government proposals: the proposals are said to be partly to reduce costs. To put this in perspective, most of the local authority costs are county. UDC's precept is only about 9% of the total council tax, and the vast range of UDC council services cost tax-payers about £140 per person per year. As our commercial investment strategy builds up, the cost to tax-payers will fall to about £104 per person a year. Essex precept is 72% of the total and 19% is fire, police and parish.

The proposal for Essex is to split it into three authorities which would cover all functions. This would presumably mean splitting all the Essex functions such as highways, education, social care, libraries and waste disposal. This must surely increase costs not decrease them. Although UDC collect waste, it is transferred to Essex at a site near Dunmow and recycling is done elsewhere by the county.

There would also be an elected Essex mayor, and no doubt a mayoral department, despite Essex County Council no longer existing. So, the reorganisation would not even remove a governance layer. If the three councils were under Labour, Conservative and independent control taking different views, there would not even be a coherent political structure. Removal of district councils would also reduce local accountability. In a much larger council local residents groups like R4U, without a national footprint, would find it more difficult to lead a council and the change would certainly concentrate power with Labour or Conservatives to the exclusion of smaller groups. Petrina did raise this in a meeting with the Minister who declined to discuss it. There would also be a reduction in the number of councillors so an increase in workload. We cannot see it being particularly attractive to be a councillor with responsibility for a very large ward with meetings at, say Harlow and be in a minority in a large council controlled by one of the two big parties, and have to deal with decisions on matters far outside of their locality.

The current structure was set up nearly 50 years ago. Any mass reorganisation would be very costly and disruptive and difficult to manage. It would be integrating not just two entities, but several district councils into one and adding a third of a county council (in disarray) on top, and a mayoralty on top of that. The IT implications of this alone are eye wateringly complex. *Continued overleaf*

In a business, there is the advantage of executive power to mandate decisions, but in the local authority world, life is more complex with the officers reporting to a chief executive and a separate political structure headed by a council leader, and with each party having its own leader.

The financial implications are also complicated. The tax take per head varies widely across the county and Uttlesford is the largest. As we continue to build our commercial investments, we will shortly have a major part of our services funded from this income rather than from taxation. I'm not sure we would be happy, having worked hard to set all this up, to have the assets and income handed over. Nor should local taxpayers be required to have responsibility for any legacy financial issues which may exist in other authorities.

I think local authorities, despite years of funding cuts, have handled the tasks and responsibilities for Covid-19 much better than some government ministries (except the Treasury). With a government that can't even deal reasonably with exam results, Brexit still unresolved and no other trade deals sorted out, which may end up triggering the break-up of the Union, we think the government needs to sort itself out before casting around elsewhere.

We noted above that UDC provides a very large range of services. Many are not obvious such as being the Port Authority for Stansted Airport, and thus dealing with Brexit changes, or being the authority which would need to attend at an exhumation. We are hopeful that these government's proposals will in the end get buried

More planning changes are afoot, interestingly the government debated one of the White Papers within days of the consultation end date.

May we gently remind all residents, of the mantra - Hands, Face, Space. We are still in difficult times.

It is with great sadness, we had to announce the death of our own, Alan Storah, who died suddenly on 11 October. He was chairing our new Local Plan Leadership Group, bringing his vast planning experience to the table. He had a smart brain and a winning smile. He often stated it was a "true joy and honour" to represent his villages. He will be sorely missed.

We are available to chat, despite surgeries being suspended. Happy to Zoom ...

#### **DEVELOPMENT DEVELOPMENTS**

Two planning appeals are scheduled for November. Fairfield's appeal against refusal of up to 350 homes between Henham and Elsenham will start on 9 November and is expected to last for eight days. Hard on its heels, an appeal will start on 24 November and last for five days against refusal of up to 99 dwellings, with 61 on the two fields off Isabel Drive and a further 38 in the field beside the motorway on the left as you enter the village from Stansted. The issues of over-development, impact on the countryside, air quality in Stansted Mountfitchet and road access are likely to be aired at both inquiries.

The size of these appeals would feed no more than a chicken of moderate size when compared with the gargantuan feast of a Planning Inquiry which is scheduled to start on 12 January, and to last for as long as 40 days. I refer to Manchester Airport Group's appeal against refusal by Uttlesford District Council of the application to increase passenger numbers at Stansted Airport. With four days a week - to give everyone time to take stock on the fifth - and possible further short breaks in between, the whole caboodle, complete with the usual panoply of barristers and consultants and sundry experts, is likely to last until the end of March.

There has been contention well in advance of the start of the Inquiry over its timing and mode. Stop Stansted Expansion made the strong claim that an Inquiry starting in the depths of winter during a pandemic is objectionable from the point of view of many of its spokesmen, who are said delicately to be 'not in the first flush of youth'. The Airport gave some support to the suggestion that a short postponement would be advisable until the fresh green shoots of spring make everyone less fearful of going outside.

But the Inspectorate, operating against a backdrop of Governmental determination to give its workings a thorough overhaul, started muttering about schedules and targets and did not yield. They said that the appeal will be held mostly through virtual means, so everyone can participate from the warmth, comfort and Covid-19-free atmosphere of their own homes. They were not impressed by claims that SSE's supporters include many for whom a virtual application is a mystery too deep to fathom.

At the same time as contesting the Appeal vigorously, SSE is keeping its legal options open through its action before the Court of Appeal which claims that the size of the application is such that it should never have been determined by a small, rural, inexpert district council. It is not exactly clear what bearing the two actions will have on each other, since it is likely that both will end up with the Secretary of State in any case. One school of thought holds that it matters not which hat he is wearing at the time - he will decide in favour of the Airport regardless of the route by which the application has got to him, and regardless also of whether the recommended decision is to approve or refuse.



The delayed spring lorry finally departed mid-July. Our autumn load (leaving mid October) could only fill a half-load as we did not have sufficient time to collect more items. We are now collecting for our (hoped for) April delivery (Brexit allowing). We have been told that there is a new law in Romania that drivers of horse and carts must wear high-viz vests/jackets. A lot of the people that we help are very poor with none having cars and only some having horse-drawn transport of their own or relying on neighbours. On the spot fines are imposed by very vigilant police. So please can you provide any **high-viz vests/jackets** (with/without logos).

Some of the goods will be given free to needy families as nominated by the local Baptist church and the town mayor, with the remainder sold through our charity shop with proceeds helping the same poor sections of the population with health, education and improving their terrible housing conditions. Items wanted:

- Summer clothes and shoes for adults and children (under 3yrs must be new).
- Single and Z beds with mattresses (sturdy iron or wooden framed beds are very desirable, no divans). Bed sheets, pillows, duvets and blankets (single and double), towels, toiletries (including loo rolls), umbrellas and rugs.
- Building and workshop tools (also some types of gardening tools and sturdy wheelbarrows).
- Surplus school tables (must be 2ft clearance underneath ie not infant) and stackable adult size chairs (please ask any contact with a local school or village hall who are/may be re-furbishing).
- Small sturdy chest of drawers (not flat pack built as these do not survive the 5 day truck journey to Romania) and bedside cabinets, folding tables. Irons and boards.
- Kitchen items (crockery, cutlery, utensils, pots/pans and especially big sizes eg preserving pans).
- Wheelchairs, crutches, walking sticks, zimmers and all sizes of bikes. Bandages
  dressings (absolutely NO pills, medicines or creams). Rucksacks and holdalls
  (must be in good condition). Costume jewellery. Suitcases but not the old
  'cardboard' types. Ear defenders for the manual workers.

If you have any of the above please bring them around to 1 Hall Close, Henham during November. Please contact me first to arrange delivery.

#### NATURAL OUTLOOK ON WHY A NO-BIRD DAY

Looking back through my Nature Diary I found a November entry where I had recorded 16 different bird species before 9:45 am. On other days I had written "a no-bird day". Such days can occur for a variety of reasons and one of them is the presence of sparrowhawks.





Although they are recorded occasionally over the years as 'overheads' or just passing through, the first detailed mention came in 2018 after I had seen a female make a long, low pass down New Road and Paul had seen a male make a failed snatch in the back. Paul was cleaning the car in the front when a female zoomed west to east between the house and the car and away. Then a couple of days later the male landed on a back garden

fence, dropped down to the flower bed and got back up again, waited a minute or two and flew off, observed all the while by a rook that followed him away as he left.

Of the two, females are noticeably bigger and have quieter plumage, a dull medium brown on head, backs and wing tops. They are barred across the front from chin to talons. Males are flashier, slate blue/grey upper parts, rufous cheeks and barring across breast and belly. Both sexes have long tails and very yellow talons and a fierce gaze. I dubbed these two 'Sid' and 'Sylvia'. They are larger than kestrels.

Their visits became rather less frequent until the following spring and after that pretty much a gap until the autumn. Sparrowhawks are, of course, about in the village and one morning on our walk for the paper, a Sylvia flashed low out of Little Glebe and up and over to the Playing field. But the visits resumed, especially Sid's who would stay longer and make return visits.

One early morning at feeding time, Sid sat on the rose arch, waiting, until he gave up and flashed away down the side of the house to encounter a neighbouring cat also waiting. Both were startled and left leaving the front clear for birds to feed. A day or two later Sid returned to the back garden and landed on the grass – all birds vanished – Sid left down the side of the house, perched on the bird table spar, waited but flew off empty-taloned.

Back again early after two days when I was still topping up the feeders, he saw me, did a 180 degree turn back down the same side of the house. All birds, except one large wood pigeon which remained motionless on the rose arch, disappeared. But he was back after I was inside. He had an unsuccessful go at a small bird, perched on the bridge rail, then on a different pole and then left for about 20 minutes returning to the rose arch before finally giving up.

They do make lucky strikes in my absence; as there is sometimes a pile of feathers under a 'plucking perch' where the victim is either dealt with or carried off to the nest with youngsters. One young female landed in the front and peered under both cars, checked there was nothing and left.

Since March, getting out in the countryside has been greatly encouraged.



Successive generations have shaped this fertile land. They have planted hedges and cut wood from ancient, coppiced woodlands, tended animals, planted orchards and harvested honey from bees. Profiting from this productive land, many constructed beautiful buildings that reflected pride in their locality. Today, a significant number of these are listed buildings. Our rich architectural tapestry is brilliantly recorded in The Hundred Parishes: An Introduction. There are a few copies still available by mail order from the Society's website or from local bookshops and Tourist Information Centres.

Museum collections of assorted artefacts and documents add another dimension to the human history of the area. Saffron Walden Museum opened in 1835 and houses a real treasure trove of historical and other material relating to the local area. A recent grant from the National Lottery Heritage Fund is enabling the development of plans to attract new visitors to the museum and adjacent castle.



Smaller museums hold collections of agricultural implements, local artefacts and archive material. The Grade II building of the Forge Museum in Much Hadham houses a collection of metal tools while striking medieval wall paintings reveal details of Tudor fashion. The Ashdon Village Museum has exhibits about life in the 20th century and the curator is updating information on the family trees of seventy local residents and preparing displays in anticipation of re-opening in the future.

We look forward to the time when our museums can safely reopen. Meanwhile, we can enjoy our heritage and celebrate the past by continuing to explore outdoors. With regular additions of new walks to the society's website, we can use these descriptive routes, some as short as one mile, to explore the cultural landscapes that make up the Hundred Parishes.

#### The Illusion of occupancy

As the nights draw in earlier, the police suggest that when you are out use table lamps on timers to come on as it gets dark to make it appear that you are in. There are now TV simulators such as Fake TV that produces lighting that resembles a television switched on within a room.

Consider installing external dusk till dawn lighting. Ensure your back gates are in good condition, closed and locked. Other products available to make it appear that you are at home are movement sensors that activates an appliance plugged into a plug socket, and doorbells that you can answer remotely after viewing the caller; an internet search will find these and other security products.

Please remember to close (lock if possible) all windows and doors when you are out, even if you just pop to the shop. A burglar is often an opportunist and is always looking out for the easy way in, so the safer we can make our property the harder it is for them. A house with lights on that looks occupied will be safer than the one in complete darkness, that appears empty.

Reflections, Ruminations, Reminiscences.

I took my first breath of Elsenham air in 1947. For the first few years of my primary school life, I frequently went to Grandad's home in Robin Hood Road. One of the main highlights was the wonderful tea served by Gran. In addition to her shortbread (previously mentioned), her salads were renowned. Grandad Franklin would serve freshly picked water cress from Elsenham water cress beds. There were two beds within the village, both producing large quantities of cress. One was near the level crossing situated at the end of Robin Hood Road. The other was in Fullers End, by the two cottages (now converted into one).

That watercress bed was maintained by Mr and Mrs Morton who then lived in one of the two cottages. They were fed by spring water running through them. The springs are still running, one flowing through Gordon Barker's garden at Broom Farm Cottage, Fullers End.

What happened to that spring which was initially the source of water for all the homes in Fullers End? It just illustrated one of the problems associated with developments within the village. Towards the end of the 1950s a sign appeared attached to the outfall pipe. This sign warned people to no longer drink from the spring. Once a source of clean, clear and fresh cold water it was now considered unfit for consumption. Many felt that it was more than coincidence that a sewage treatment plant for some new homes had been constructed not far from the springs and the watercress beds.

Large numbers enjoyed walking to those beds and cutting a bundle of cress, 'for a few pence,' in pre decimal days. One is tempted to speculate just how much one of those bundles would cost today

### GIRL, WOMAN, OTHER

'This is Britain as you've never read it. This is Britain as it has never been told. From Newcastle to Cornwall, from the birth of the twentieth century to the teens of the twenty-first, Girl, Woman, Other follows a cast of twelve characters on their personal journeys through this country and the last hundred years. They're each looking for something - a shared past, an unexpected future, a place to call home, somewhere to fit in, a lover, a missed mother, a lost father, even just a touch of hope...' So says the blurb on the back of the book.

This was the choice of the book group this month. We had a good discussion of the book, which was generally well-liked. The book was the joint winner of the 2019 Booker Prize (with The Testaments by Margaret Atwood).

Each of the 12 narratives centres on a black woman with a lively and diverse cast of supporting characters - sometimes generations of that character's family, sometimes friends, sometimes employers or offspring. Their stories link very loosely around the first character, Amma, her daughter, Yazz and Amma's school friend, Shirley.

Each story is different and this maintains interest and avoids any blurring between them, e.g. ranging from a lesbian theatre dramatist, to a city banker, to a Northumbrian farmer, to a schoolteacher. The first two are perhaps a little long but many of these are page-turners and their stories are well-told, with humanity and humour. Naturally, some of the characters are more likeable than others and happier than others; our unanimous favourite was Hattie. Several of us made a little map/diagram of how the women inter-connected.

Taken together, the stories challenge a number of pre-conceptions. We see the complexity of the backgrounds of many black Britons, lack of opportunity and the implications of wanting something different from life.

Some of the characters come together at an event at the end, which perhaps is a little political. Also, finally, one of the characters discovers her true heritage and her reaction to it is quite lovely and beautifully written.

Finally, the lack of punctuation and capital letters was a slightly annoying distraction for some of us.

#### HARE COURSING IN ELSENHAM & SURROUNDING VILLAGES

#### Would you know what to do if you saw hare coursers?

Gangs of men with lurcher dogs and 4x4 vehicles appear on the fields around our villages after harvest, when the land is easy to move across. In the daytime you may see these coursers walking the fields, ready for a hare to bolt. Their cars will be close for a quick getaway or parked up near our homes and footpaths. When a hare makes a move to escape they release a lurcher to pursue it. Someone from the group will film the chase, and live-stream footage to gamblers who have bet money on the result. Which dog will kill the most hares? Prized dogs are bought and sold on the dark web for up to £20,000.

Illegal but common in our area, hare coursing is punishable by imprisonment and fines of up to £5,000 can be issued. The crime is hard to prevent because of the type of people who do it; often arriving in convoy with 'minders' to the front and rear. In cars with false number plates, uninsured and untaxed. Individuals have tried to confront coursers and have been abused; farmers received death threats and have seen their barns and cars burnt. These violent groups have known links to illegal gambling, firearms and drugs. Their crimes in our area involve poaching and trespassing, road traffic offences, damage to crops and property. They prey where local farmers feel isolated and inflict huge suffering on hare and deer populations. It's best to avoid engaging with coursers.

#### WHAT SHOULD YOU DO if you witness this kind of activity?

PC Matt Harkness, from the Rural Engagement Team, advises, "If you see coursing in progress, dogs chasing hares, or people breaking into land to course, then please call 999 immediately". Give the exact location, with descriptions and numbers of vehicles, people and dogs. It is also useful to mention you are aware of police Operation Galileo.

The most helpful location code comes from smart phone app What3Words. Download the app in advance and use it to generate the unique code for your precise location. Pinpointing a remote field is a struggle without that vital detail! If the report is second hand, or suspected, or a few hours old then, please still report to ⁴essex.police.uk or ☎101 or anonymously to Crime Stoppers ☎0800 555 111.

Small pieces of information build an intelligence picture of what's happening, who is involved and where the police are needed most. Left unreported, Essex Police can't get a clear idea of crime levels around our village or be able to police it effectively.

Surge for mental health support prompts new campaign

The Management Committee of the Elsenham Community Association (ECA) has taken advice from the Rural County Council of Essex, which is its advisory body, regarding re-opening the hall. #### COOKERY CORNER

Made with parsnips, this makes a moist and delicious alternative to carrot cake.



#### PARSNIP AND ORANGE SPICED CAKE (Serves 10-12)

8oz (230g) self-raising flour Frosting:

1 teaspoon baking powder 2oz (50g) unsalted butter, softened

1 teaspoon ground cinnamon 7oz (200g) full fat cream cheese

½ teaspoon ground nutmeg 5oz (150g) icing sugar

2 teaspoons ground mixed spice 1 orange, zested and some extra walnut pieces

7oz (200g) caster sugar for decoration (optional)

3½oz (100g) walnuts, chopped

3 medium eggs, beaten

5 fl oz (150ml) sunflower oil

1lb 2oz (500g) parsnips, peeled, ends trimmed and coarsely grated

2 oranges, zested

Heat the oven to 180°C/160°C fan/Gas Mark 4. Grease and line two 8 inch (20.5cm) sandwich cake tins with baking paper.

Sift the flour into a large mixing bowl with the baking powder, cinnamon, nutmeg and mixed spice. Add the caster sugar and chopped walnuts. Mix together and set aside.

In a separate bowl, put the eggs and sunflower oil. Beat for a few minutes. Then mix all the dry ingredients into the egg and oil mixture, adding the grated parsnips and orange zest. Mix everything together thoroughly for about 2 minutes.

Divide the mixture between the two cake tins, levelling off with a spatula. Bake for 25-30 minutes until the cakes are golden and a skewer inserted into the middle comes out clean. Leave to cool in the tins for about 10 minutes. Then turn out onto a wire rack to cool down completely.

Meanwhile, in a medium bowl, beat the softened butter. Mix in the cream cheese and icing sugar until just combined. Do not overbeat. Leave in fridge until you are ready to use. Sandwich cakes together with the frosting, then use the remainder to spread all over. Sprinkle with walnuts and orange zest.

**CHEF'S RECOMMENDATIONS:** These cakes freeze well without frosting. If you have one, use a food processor to grate the parsnips.
