Schools extended their admissions on 1 June 2020. Essex County Cllr. Ray Gooding praised Linda Reid, Head Teacher at Elsenham Primary School, and her team for their outstanding work, preparing for the children to return to school, and giving up their Easter Holiday to make sure everything was in place.

Mrs Reid has presented Zoom meetings to over 100 parents, sent out videos of the classrooms, given instructions on entering the school and explaining how she and her team will educate and care for the children while maintaining social distancing. This has given parents confidence that their children will be safe while attending Elsenham Primary School.

The Elsenham Youth Football Club (EYFC) has been unable to use the football field for practising or playing games since going into lockdown due to Coronavirus. The Parish Council has, therefore, as a gesture of goodwill, waived the quarterly payment.

EROWOS Committee is taking over the management of the triangular piece of grass between the copse and the children's play area, they hope to encourage the growth of wildflowers.

Before progressing with the adult gym, which would be installed on the playing field, a short questionnaire will be placed on social media, asking residents whether such equipment would be welcome. A grant will be required for the gym, prices range from £10K to £20K, depending on the number of pieces purchased.

Members of the Planning Committee are holding a Zoom meeting with members of Uttlesford District Council Planning Department, to try and make some progress with the new Community Hall.

If social distancing is to be maintained, a double decker bus with 80 passenger capacity will only be allowed to take 17 passengers. The instruction from Department of Transport is that when the bus has reached its reduced capacity it should not stop at any further bus stops. This could leave passengers stranded. Essex County Cllr. Ray Gooding has written to the Secretary of State voicing his concerns.

A big thank you goes to all the volunteers who have offered to water the flowerbeds in the village.



Recently we have enjoyed above average hours of sunshine and walking or cycling along paths, bridleways and less busy roads has enabled us to admire the abundance of wildflowers and their insect visitors on field margins and wayside verges.

Many of these insects are the familiar pollinators such as butterflies, hoverflies and bees. For obvious reasons, observations of insect / plant interactions after dark are less well studied, especially pollination activities. Concerns about the impact of bright lights on the behaviour of night-flying moths assumed a greater importance when a report published in 2017 revealed that crop yields could be reduced by as much as 13% in well-lit areas as the pollinating moths became disorientated. Ongoing research is revealing the importance of various moths in pollinating flowers, including those of crops such as soft fruits, peas and beans.

Moths transport pollen on their tongues and undersides as they flit from flower to flower under the cover of darkness. Maintaining a wide variety of food plants for their caterpillars is a good reason for the retention of unmown verges, wildflower meadows or flower-rich gardens.

Darker nights also help our own appreciation of the wonders of the

universe. Away from 'civilisation' there are many excellent locations for star gazing across the Hundred Parishes where there is little artificial light after dark. You can check the details for your own location on the online map of CPRE's 2020 star count on www.cpre.org.uk/starcountresults.

Bright lights can be intrusive and there are concerns about their impact on human health and wellbeing. Local councils can adopt policies to tackle light pollution and protect our dark skies. Minimising the use of bright lights can save money and will enable moths to keep busy with their valuable pollination services in unlit areas.

The Hundred Parishes is 450 square miles of northwest Essex, northeast Hertfordshire and southern Cambridgeshire that is largely unspoilt and is richly endowed with many fine examples of agricultural and built heritage The area has shared a common history which shaped and preserved its distinctive landscape of small and medium-sized farms linked by winding lanes and ancient rights of way to hamlets, villages and then to small market towns. 

ELSENHAM VILLAGE HISTORY SOCIETY

Having perused the answers to the Village quiz last month I wondered how you all got on. Were you enthused enough to go looking for more information on some of the answers? One correspondent certainly was and contacted us to find out more about the shooting of Mrs Dixon mentioned in the answer to question 15.



Following some digging into Parish records and going back and forth with our correspondent we ascertained that Mrs Dixon was Rose Eliza Thomas born 12 September 1905 in Bethnal Green London. She died on 6 July 1940 in the Herts & Essex Hospital just a few days after the shooting aged 34.

Her parents were Henry William Thomas born in 1876 in Bethnal Green London and Rose Tenison born in 1879 in East London. On the 1939 Register it shows them being the licensees of the Robin Hood Pub. She was married to Lawrence Dixon who was born in 1896 in Elsenham. They married in 1928 in Bishop's Stortford and he died on 21 November 1951.

It is always pleasing when we are able to flesh out the bones of a story like this and my thanks go to our correspondents Graham Jackson and Chris Bush for their research.

As an aside to the above, if you would like to know more about The Story of The Robin Hood Public House then the publication of that name is just for you. It contains 24 pages and many memorable photographs, costs £3 and is available through our website.

Meanwhile, we continue to seek material for the Elsenham Corona Diaries so whatever stories and anecdotes you may have of the lockdown, please consider passing them along.

Looking ahead our next meeting is due to be held on Wednesday 9 September 2020 at 8pm in the Memorial Hall. Our speaker is Anthony Tuck, who has spoken to us before, from the Newport Local History Group who will be speaking about "Newport: A Great and Poor Town". DEVELOPMENT DEVELOPMENTS

There are three different types of planning appeal, depending mostly on the size of the application, and at the moment Elsenham has one of each type outstanding. Most appeals are decided by written submissions, and this method is in use for the appeal regarding 'Crossways', Station Road, where the proposal to knock down the existing house and other buildings and replace with three four-bedroom houses was refused by Uttlesford District Council Planning Committee in December 2019.

The planning officer who recommended approval got into a muddle over parking standards, but the Planning Department has stood him on his head and now agrees with the Parish Council that there is not enough parking space and that the application amounts to over-development in the centre of the village. The Parish Council added for good measure that the applicants were not entitled to fill in the drainage ditch at the rear, and that the provisions concerning replacement dwellings should apply. As no meeting is needed, the decision might be issued fairly soon.

Next in the hierarchy of planning appeals is determination by a hearing, which means that all the interested parties gather round a table and the Inspector hears what they have to say in a fairly informal but still structured way. Typically the hearing lasts for a day or so. The appeal against refusal of up to 40 new dwellings in the field at the bottom of Rush Lane, adjacent to the railway, would have been heard through this method by now were it not for the Coronavirus emergency. The Planning Inspectorate is now attempting to get to grips with what is becoming known as 'the new normal' by holding virtual meetings. UDC's main ground for objection to the application is the impact on the countryside; the Parish Council points out that countryside has diminished in and around the village recently, making all the more reason to preserve what is left.

The largest appeals are held by means of a public inquiry, and that will be the method for the appeal by Fairfield concerning their application to build up to 350 new homes off Henham Road. An inquiry is rather more like a court hearing, with legal eagles and cross-examination and so on. Humble members of the public can attend and even have a say, but can expect the legal big-wigs to look down their judicial noses at them, in the nicest possible way of course. The issues are likely to be planning policy generally, transport, air quality and landscape, with both sides calling their own witnesses in the form of consultants charging significant fees as a token of the depth of their claimed expertise, and the whole shebang going on for several days.

Quite how appeals by virtual meetings will work out, given that participants will be in their own homes and the possible technical hiccups, including forgetting to unmute, and frozen attitudes through insufficient bandwidth, and so on, remains to be seen. But it could be interesting. Or not.



This has been such a shock to our everyday lives and as I write this we still don't know what the future looks like. The pandemic has caused much death, sorrow and fear. Even for those not infected, the everyday things of life, the things we took for granted, have been taken away from us or significantly adjusted. Holidays abroad and at home have been cancelled. We have been separated from family and friends. Work and school life has changed. We live under the "2 metre rule".

This has been difficult for regular church– goers and those planning weddings and funeral services in church. The churches have been trying to play catch-up ever since as the government advice has changed over time, and no doubt we haven't always got it right.

As we saw what other churches were doing we started doing a weekly recording (from home) of a full service with songs and prayers and Bible readings and a talk on video and uploading it on to YouTube, linking in contributions from other people. (YouTube, search for Henham, Elsenham and Ugley Churches.)

Other church members have similarly found themselves using technology in new ways. A lot of prayer meetings and fellowship groups and church business meetings are now done via the internet by video-conferencing software such as Zoom. Indeed in early May, the Zoom platform experienced serious connection problems resulting in an amusing tweet 'Looks like the church broke the internet' as thousands streamed their Sunday morning services.

Of course none of these are substitutes for the real thing – for actual face to face fellowship with each other. We crave relationship - a phone call can mean so much – seeing other friends on a computer screen can be uplifting-

but we hunger for more. We are relational people made in the image of the only one and true God, Father, Son and Spirit in loving fellowship. We're glad that our churches are now able to be open for private prayer (open to all - have a look at the church notices for details) but we long for the time when we can all regularly meet together for worship.

At this difficult time of lockdown, we need to remember that the church is not the building but the people. We worship God in Spirit and in Truth and we can truly have real spiritual fellowship without being in the same building as we join with God by His Spirit and gather together using technology. Indeed, God can't be locked down. He is not confined to a building but the God of the Universe!

The apostle Paul speaking in Athens said: "The God who made the world and everything in it is the Lord of heaven and earth and does not live in temples built by hands." (Acts 17:24).

Some sort of normality will return, we don't know quite when but God does. Look ahead to the time when we can gather together in the same place but in the meantime we are to worship God, whether we can physically get to church or not. God wants people to reach out to Him! He is to be our Lord and King, we are to look to Him and give Him honour and praise.

More people are praying today than have for many years because of this pandemic and more and more people are asking deep questions about God. Why not have a look at the church website heuchurch.co.uk for more of what is going on (like the Christianity Explored course) and check out the YouTube service. Life on earth is fleeting and fragile but look to God, who sent His Son Jesus, to bring us into a loving fellowhip with Himself by His Spirit and a life forever with Him.

NATURAL OUTLOOK ON DIFFERENT SURROUNDINGS

Last July we actually had a holiday! It was in Northumberland and we stayed in a village inland from Bamburgh and the Farne Islands. Lovely country and by exploring got to know some species new to me and to see some already known but in much greater numbers.



Apart from the usuals, I saw for the first time bloody cranesbill which is a medium sized plant of the cranesbill family with bright magenta flowers. This was mixed in with many more familiar plants, for example: whites, ox-eyedaisies, wild carrot, white clover, upright hedge parsley; for yellows, meadow vetchling, lady's bedstraw, common cat's ear: mauves, self heal, tufted vetch: pinks, rest harrow and the tall, rosebay willow herb. Round here, the blue meadow cranesbill is a rarity – there is a special roadside verge devoted to it in Clavering – but in Yorkshire and Northumberland there are many splendid stretches.

We had two wonderful sea trips to see the offshore wildlife. The first was around Coquet Island. Again some of the things to be seen were familiar but were seen in their hundreds or thousands, puffins, guillemots, cormorants and gannets. Less familiar were common and roseate terns and even two little terns.

Then there were the 'common' or 'harbour' seals. The males are about two metres long and the females smaller. They have round heads and their nostrils make a distinct 'V'. A variety of grey or brown colours with darker spots. They haul out to shore in June or July to give birth. Our boat kept a good distance. You can also see these round the Essex coast now that their numbers are growing.



On a second sea trip, this time a partial tour of the Farne Islands, we saw grey seals. The males, are much heavier and longer at 3.8 metres, but the females are rather smaller. Their heads are wedge-shaped, settling into a good, thick neck. Their breeding season is late summer and early

autumn and they are much more prevalent than harbour seals. You may well have seen them around the Essex coast and especially the Norfolk

coastline. Again there were many birds: thousands of puffins and guillemots, dozens of cormorants and shags, some common terns, sandwich terns and some eider ducks in eclipse. This is an incomplete list of the wildlife things that we saw and admired and we hope to revisit the area next year, fingers crossed.

Do you participate in Facebook quizzes?



People are being urged to stop participating in seemingly innocent online quizzes during the coronavirus pandemic, as they could be unknowingly exposing themselves to online hackers. Information shared when people complete questionnaires online can be collated by sophisticated hackers to gain access to a host of personal accounts, say cyber security experts.

With many people spending more time on social media while self-isolating due to COVID-19, there has been a rise in people sharing detailed information about their lives to Facebook.

Popular trends involve people answering a series of questions relating to their lives, and often include the name of their family pet, the school they attended, the cars they drove and names of loved ones. While this may appear an innocent concept, it is these quizzes that have made it easier for hackers to guess people's passwords based on the details revealed in their answers. Lots of people use words like the name of their dog for a password, and lots of online accounts only require a password to gain access. Most people don't use random passwords; they use passwords that are easy for them to remember. Make it harder for the hackers by using passwords that are not associated with your home family friends and pets.

'Tom Hanks explores in his first work of fiction, a collection of stories that dissects, with great affection, humour and insight, the human condition and all its foibles. The stories are linked by one thing: in each of them, a typewriter plays a part, sometimes minor, sometimes central. To many, typewriters represent a level of



sometimes central. To many, typewriters represent a level of craftsmanship, beauty and individuality that is harder and harder to find in the modern world. In his stories, Tom Hanks gracefully reaches that typewriter-worthy level. Known for his honesty and sensitivity as an actor, Tom Hanks brings both those characteristics to his writing. By turns whimsical, moving and occasionally melancholy, Uncommon Type is a book that will delight as well as surprise his millions of fans. It also establishes him as a welcome and wonderful new voice in contemporary fiction, a voice that perceptively delves beneath the surface of friendships, families, love and normal, everyday behaviour.' So says the blurb on the back of the book.

This was the choice of the book group this month. A collection of short stories from the actor Tom Hanks, inspired by his love of and collection of typewriters. Generally we liked it. However, we were all of the same opinion that only a few of the stories had substance and several just didn't stick with us. Most stories were quite nice to read but some were instantly forgettable. It was a light easy read, perfect for these lockdown times when concentration is more difficult. So short stories are easy as one can read one or two a night. It is great for dipping into and not perhaps to be read in one sitting.

There are 17 stories in total. There are four characters that feature in a few of the stories: a hectic sexual affair between two best friends; friends going to the moon and back in a rocket ship constructed in the backyard and a triumph in the bowling alley. There are also a few features from a small-town newspaper columnist with old-fashioned views of the modern world. Other stories feature a World War II veteran dealing with his emotional and physical scars; a second-rate actor plunged into sudden stardom and a whirlwind press junket; a woman adjusting to life in a new neighbourhood after her divorce; a teenage surfer stumbling into his father's secret life; a person addicted to time travelling back to the state fair of New York and a rather sweet story about a second-hand typewriter bought by someone who wants to start to write.

Apart from the connected stories, the stories stand alone and the only connection is that they all include a reference to a typewriter.

This is a recipe I have shared with many over the years - rich, luscious Florentine biscuits, gorgeous served with tea or coffee either in the morning or after dinner. Absolutely no flour involved!



FLORENTINE SLICES (Makes 12 to 16)

- 8 oz (225g) dark chocolate, broken into pieces
- 2 oz (50g) butter or margarine
- 4 oz (100g) demerara sugar
- 1 egg beaten
- 2 oz (50g) mixed dried fruit
- 4 oz (100g) coconut
- 2 oz (50g) quartered glacé cherries

Put the chocolate in bowl and melt over hot water. Spoon into well greased $7\frac{1}{2}$ inch (19cm) square cake tin. Spread over bottom and leave to set.

Meanwhile, cream together the butter and sugar until mixture is light and fluffy. Beat in egg thoroughly. Mix together remaining ingredients and add to creamed mixture. Spoon into the tin and spread over set chocolate.

Bake in centre of cool oven (150C/300F/gas Mark 2) for 40 to 45 minutes, until golden brown. Remove from the oven and leave for five minutes. Carefully mark into 12 or 16 squares with a sharp knife. Leave until quite cold, then loosen with a palette knife and lift each square carefully from the tin.

CHEF'S RECOMMENDATIONS: If you haven't any mixed dried fruit, it is fine to substitute sultanas, raisins, cranberries or any dried chopped fruit. Instead of glacé cherries, you could use chopped mixed peel which is as equally delicious. After cooking and cooling the Florentines, put the tin in the refrigerator until really cold. This way, the slices will come out without any trouble.
