

DEVELOPMENT DEVELOPMENTS

Here we go again. That was the inevitable reaction to the news that an outline planning application for 130 homes will be submitted for the field opposite the Crown by Countryside, an outfit which has not previously proposed to grace the village. The site was included when Uttlesford District Council conducted its 'Call for Sites' operation. UDC still has not produced its draft local plan, which seems to recede further and further away, much like the pot of gold at the end of the rainbow. Obviously, these developers have decided to put their application in now in case the site is not included in the local plan. Other developers will no doubt do the same throughout the district, with the possibility that by the time the local plan is eventually formulated, the district already has enough houses committed.

To talk or not to talk? That is the question facing the Parish Council. It's tempting to shrug and walk away, muttering, 'do your worst'. However, if we do that we won't gain anything. It would be more sensible to make the case early on for a substantial contribution to the new Community Hall - insisting that it is done without prejudice to the position of opposition to the whole scheme.

Two revised detailed applications have been lodged, inconveniently close to one another in time, for sites in the village which already have outline planning permission. One of many ways in which the planning system is loaded in favour of developers is that they control the timetable. Insufficient time was given for reviewing the 140 or so new documents submitted with the application from Bloor Homes, for 'up to' 350 dwellings off Henham Road. The application is due before the late April meeting of UDC's Planning Committee.

Hard on the heels of Bloor comes Dandara, with their revised application for 99 homes split between Isabel Drive and Stansted Road and including a mere 90 or so new documents. Their application includes some most egregious errors - inconsistencies as to dwelling types, faults which were pointed out to them several months ago. There is no penalty for making mistakes - indeed it hardly matters. Either they correct them and try again, or, more likely, they don't bother and nobody minds. But if their building is on a par with their documents, there will be some very confused houses.

UDC's Planning Committee is getting to grips with the Council's 'designation', whereby major developers now have the option of applying direct to the Planning Inspectorate on account of the number of refusals overturned at appeal. At the last meeting of the Committee, one councillor proposed approval of a large application with a heavy heart', after the Planning Officer said that refusal would be followed by a successful appeal, which would not help UDC's case for the designation to be lifted. But the councillor should have realised that in effect the Planning Committee's role always has been to guess the outcome if an application goes to appeal and make their own decision accordingly - the Committee has very little by way of real autonomy.

This time the talk would look at how the village had changed over the years and how, for example, the coming of the railway had affected the people then living here. The talk also used old maps to show how the village has changed and grown over the years.

Our thanks go to Jennifer and Laura for giving us the opportunity "to spread the word" so to speak and to Ray Franklin and David Verlander who presented the talks.

Whilst on the subject of thanks, our thanks must also go to Roger Taylor who has kindly donated a series of colour slides showing the building of the M11 motorway through the village. As usual, these will be digitally scanned and in due course posted in our website galleries to bolster the already wide range of information to be found within its pages. Don't forget to look at our website from time to time to catch up on all the new material that our webmaster adds to keep it fresh.

Our next meeting will be on Wednesday 8th June at 8pm in the Memorial Hall when we will welcome Anthony Tuck from the Newport Local History Group. He will be speaking about "Newport, A Great and Poor Town", the story of our neighbour just a little way up the road.

Garden Hint - homemade weed killer

Thought For The Month

It would be terrible to live in a country where there is no rule of law; where everyone does as they see fit, and where there is no-one to speak up for the disadvantaged; no challenge to the might of the strong. Not many of us would have liked to live in the 'wild west' of America before the sheriff came to town. Most would agree that we need rules to govern us, but even so we are still prone to complain if we are thwarted by a certain law or caught speeding, etc.

Our most famous court of justice at the Old Bailey has at its tallest point the 'Lady of Justice' who holds both a sword and a pair of scales. The scales point to the weighing of the evidence from both sides of the argument and the sword represents the swift implementation of the sentence.

We value trial by jury for the more serious cases and accept the verdict of the magistrate in more mundane cases. But in either situation we are 'tried' by our peers, albeit some are more knowledgeable of the law than others. If the accused pleads 'not guilty' then we have to weigh the evidence and form judgements on the truthfulness of the witnesses, and only then can we come to an opinion on guilt. But whichever way the verdict lies, we can't rule out the possibility of a miscarriage of justice. The innocent might still be convicted, and the guilty might still walk free. And occasionally the sentence itself will be appealed. In the end, our best efforts at delivering justice are always going to be imperfect, because we are not perfect.

With God though, his judgements are always right. Not one of us would want our neighbours or our nearest and dearest to know everything that we had said and done, and we certainly would not want them to be able to read all of our thoughts. But God sees it all. Nothing escapes him. And unlike us, 'God lives in unapproachable light'.

While we are grubby, he is only pure and right and good. No-one can come into his presence and survive. In *Hosea 10 v8* we read that people will say to the 'mountains cover us and to the hills fall on us' for the prospect of meeting a holy God when we are unforgiven is a terrible one. God does not judge us by weighing our good deeds against our bad deeds as we might hope – he judges against an absolute standard. And all of us are woefully short of that. It is precisely because God is perfect, that he can't mix with people who are tainted by sin. Our eternal destiny is to be separated from a loving, good and holy God.

But you might ask 'why can't God just forgive my sin', after all he is all love? As in our world all wrongdoing must be dealt with, so God also must punish all sin. However, in His love for us God sent his son Jesus to rescue us from God's terrible judgement. Jesus led a perfect and sinless life here on earth. By dying on the cross and taking all our sin upon his shoulders, Jesus took the full weight of God's punishment that should have fallen on us. Justice has been done, because our sin has now been punished.

And in his love, Jesus has given to us all his righteous deeds, so that God the Father now looks on us and sees people who have lived the selfless and obedient life that Jesus lived. And all we have to do, is to accept this swap – our sins, for Jesus' righteous deeds. This is God's free offer to us all, to accept Jesus as our Saviour and Lord as we remembered last month at Faster.

I pray that our hearts, minds and eyes will be opened to see God and acknowledge Him as our loving and holy Saviour. That way we need have no fear of the sword of justice; and we can be assured of God's welcome at the end of time.

NATURAL OUTLOOK

Last May was one of the most dismal that I have recorded in my nature notes; normally the temperature fluctuates between frosts and days around 30C. Last year it did the frosts but scarcely did the latter. And it rained, icy rain and blew with its wind. There were just one or two 'proper May days' but this did not stop the spring unrolling, just slowed it down. This year it might even be early.



By now, hawthorns, be they sole, tall shrubs or hedges, are close to being in full, bright green leaf and other trees, be they spindle, hazel, beech or field maple, are well away. Whether it's oak or ash next depends on "whether we're in for a splash' or, if ash first, 'were in for a soak'. The crab apples on De Mandeville Green are in flower as are sloe bushes in the field hedges with their white blossom and on warm days later in the month you can smell the scent of hawthorn blossom. In The Spinney the big cherries are looking their best. The canopy in woodland areas is noticeably closing over, shading out the bluebells and white anemones.

Bird activity intensifies; sparrows, starlings, finches, tits, wood pigeons, collared doves, aquatics and raptors continue to nest build and lay eggs. Some eggs have hatched, look out for discarded eggshells; Fairly small ones mid-blue with dark spots are from song thrushes and paler blue ones with beige scribbles from blackbirds, starlings' are a bit larger and white and, since they nest round here, sparrowhawks' might turn up. Theirs are rather larger that blackbirds' or thrushes', have a white main ground colour with rich, reddish brown markings and sometimes some purple blotches. Mallards' eggs are about the size of a domestic ducks and are plain but with a range of pale shades from white, buff or a pale greenish white. Then the adults feed their nestlings; blackbirds and others probe the softened turf for worms or grubs. Others peck insects or caterpillars from plants or trees and sparrowhawks hunt for prey, usually small birds to start with. That's why they are more often seen, not just in gardens but swooping low around the village.

I get fun out of watching starling families when the young are just out of the nest; adults are in their shiny, speckled plumage but the juveniles have dull brown feathers and rather oversized feet. They chase after their parents, squawking for food and being fed by a harassed mum or dad. Next stage is when they go round feeding themselves, even taking food from 'the cafe' and eventually racing their parents to get at it first. Sparrows can behave in much the same way. Last year one family was born with splotches of white in their feathers so were easy to identify. Gradually we saw less of them, either because they had been easy prey or because their plumage became more adult. As I write, the house martins appear to be taking interest in last year's nest over the Fish Bar. We wait and see.

Not much space to write about other 'goings on' but keep your eyes out for the roadside verges which about now come into bloom with mainly white flowers.



Public and private gardens provide opportunities for pleasurable exercise and social interaction. Our local sunny climate and fertile soils have encouraged those with green fingers to hone their design and horticultural skills to create some outstanding flower-rich gardens for their own delight. Some, like Bridge End Garden in Saffron Walden (*right*), are free but entry charges do apply at others.

Many delightful gardens are listed in the current National Garden Scheme handbook and website, www.ngs.org.uk
This is a major showcase for owners who are willing to share their gardens with others; last year £3 million was donated by

visitors to help nursing and health charities. Some gardens have limited opening days, others more frequent opportunities to appreciate seasonal changes; some offer opportunities for booked group visits.

Some gardens open early to showcase spring flowers but as spring gives way to summer, more are opened to show off the variety of brightly-coloured blooms and intense floral fragrances, especially from roses. Enthusiastic and knowledgeable owners may specialise in growing cottage garden flowers, others in designing

hidden features or ponds and all are willing to share their

passions with visitors.

With so many varied gardens to visit it is a challenge to decide which one should top your list! I would recommend including Easton Lodge, (*left*) where Harold Peto's Italian garden is always colourful and recent restoration works to the balustrade have enhanced this area.

Throughout the summer at Henry Moore Studios & Gardens at Perry Green (*right*), many of Moore's sculptures are displayed in a garden setting and an exhibition focuses on his work in the Sixties.

The What's On listing on the Hundred Parishes website includes dates for individual open gardens and also where a village has organised a group of open gardens, sometimes with added attractions like cream teas. Enjoy!

The Hundred Parishes is 450 square miles of northwest Essex, northeast Hertfordshire and southern Cambridgeshire that is largely unspoilt and is richly endowed with many fine examples of agricultural and built heritage The area has shared a common history which shaped and preserved its distinctive landscape of small and medium-sized farms linked by winding lanes and ancient rights of way to hamlets, villages and then to small market towns. Over 20,000 people fell victim to remote access scams

More than £50 million was lost last year to scams where victims are tricked into handing over control of their computer or smartphone to criminals.

New data from Action Fraud, the national reporting centre for fraud and cyber-crime, reveals that **20,144** people fell victim to scams where they were persuaded to grant criminals remote access to their device.

Victims reported losing a total of £57,790,384 – an average loss of £2,868 per victim.

What are remote access scams

Remote Access scams will often begin with a browser pop-up saying that your computer is infected with a virus, or maybe a call from someone claiming to be from your bank saying that they need to connect to your computer in order to cancel a fraudulent transaction on your account. Regardless of the narrative the fraudsters use, their goal is to steal your money or access your financial information by tricking you into allowing them to remotely connect to your computer.

DCI Craig Mullish, from the City of London Police, said:

"While remote access tools are safe when used legitimately, we want the public to be aware that they can be misused by criminals to perpetrate fraud. We often see criminals posing as legitimate businesses in order to trick people into handing over control of their computer or smartphone.

"You should only install software or grant remote access to your computer if you're asked by someone you know and trust, such as a friend or family member, and never as a result of an unsolicited call, browser pop-up or text message."

How to protect yourself

Only install software or grant remote access to your computer if you're asked by someone you know and trust, such as a friend or family member, and never as a result of an unsolicited call, browser pop up, or text message.

Remember, a bank or service provider will never contact you out of the blue requesting remote access to your device.

If you believe your laptop, PC, tablet or phone has been infected with a virus or some other type of malware, follow the NCSC's guidance on recovering an infected device.

Protect your money by contacting your bank immediately on a different device

from the one the scammer contacted you on.

Report it to Action Fraud on 0300 123 2040 or via actionfraud.police.uk.

½ bunch chives, finely chopped

When doing a roast for a big celebration, the trimmings that go with it should feel special too. You don't need to put in too much extra effort, though, as this recipe proves. Your vegetarian quests will love it as well.



CHEESY GREEN VEGETABLE GRATIN (serves 6-8)

1 small cauliflower – 1lb (450g) broken into florets, leaves reserved 7oz (200g) purple sprouting broccoli 7oz (200g) spinach 3oz (70g) unsalted butter 3oz (70g) plain flour 1½ pints (900ml) milk 2 teaspoons English mustard 5oz (150g) mature cheddar

Bring a pan of lightly salted water to the boil and cook the cauliflower florets for 3 minutes. Add the broccoli and cook for 2 minutes more. Drain in a colander and leave to steam dry.

Tip the spinach into a large colander over a large saucepan of boiling water, cook for 3-4 minutes until wilted, then tip into a sieve and press the excess moisture out of it with the back of a wooden spoon. Set aside.

Heat the oven to 220°C/200°C fan/gas mark 7. Melt the butter in a saucepan over a low heat until foaming then stir in the flour to create a thick paste. Cook for 2 minutes, remove the pan from the heat and whisk in the milk in several additions until lump-free. Return to the heat and whisk until thickened. Whisk in the mustard, most of the cheese and the chives. Season to taste.

Arrange the vegetables, including the cauliflower leaves, in a medium ovenproof dish. Pour over the sauce, then sprinkle with the remaining cheese. Bake for 25-30 minutes or until golden and bubbling.

CHEF'S RECOMMENDATIONS: Use the vegetable cooking water instead of some of the milk to make up the sauce. For a crisp topping, mix 1oz (25g) soft white breadcrumbs with about 2oz (50g) cheese and scatter over the vegetables.


THE DRY

'WHO REALLY KILLED THE HADLER FAMILY?

Amid the worst drought to ravage Australia in a century, it hasn't rained in small country town Kiewarra for two years. Tensions in the community become unbearable when three members of the Hadler family are brutally murdered. Everyone thinks Luke Hadler, who committed suicide after slaughtering his wife and six-year-old son, is guilty.



Policeman Aaron Falk returns to the town of his youth for the funeral of his childhood best friend and is unwillingly drawn into the investigation. As questions mount and suspicion spreads through the town, Falk is forced to confront the community that rejected him twenty years earlier. Because Falk and Luke Hadler shared a secret, one which Luke's death threatens to unearth. And as Falk probes deeper into the killings, secrets from his past and why he left home bubble to the surface as he questions the truth of his friend's crime. ...' So says the blurb on the back of the book.

'Spellbinding' - Ian Rankin

The Dry was the choice of the book group this month. At 366 pages it is quite a substantial read but a page turner so doesn't feel like a long read.

This was enjoyed and liked by all — some of us have read the second Aaron Falk novel and her other books too. A recent film is available on Sky TV.

It is a debut novel but is written with an assured confidence. The book is well paced, the characters are fully formed and the descriptions of the environment are very evocative and credible. The tension is high and exciting.

It is a whodunnit but with a very personal angle as Aaron and Luke grew up in this small town. Aaron left town as a teenager with his father and moved to Melbourne, where he joined the police force as a financial crime investigator. Luke stayed behind, married, became a farmer and joined the rest of the farming community—a community that depends on water for its livestock and livelihoods. People are angry, worried and desperate. In the midst of all this, Luke appears to have shot his wife and child and committed suicide. Most people are horrified but believe, given his worries, a man could be driven to such acts. However, not all believe this so, if not him then who and why.

Aaron stays to investigate the murder because he is asked to by Luke's parents. Aaron is not liked nor welcomed by most in the town due to a long grievance held against Aaron. However, this is a chance to also right that wrong and learn more about Aaron and his relationship with his father, Luke, Gretchen and unearth other secrets... like the one about Ellie's death.
