

We have a new prime minister and government and, for the first time in 70 years, we have a new monarch. On behalf of our district council we wrote to King Charles III to express our most sincere condolences to him and the Royal Family.

Members and officers at district councils have been working flat-out to ensure their local communities could properly mourn the Queen and that the King has been proclaimed. During the period of mourning, political activity was suspended.

I was asked recently about the poor performance by UDC on planning applications. This means that we have had 17% of appeals overturned following the Planning Committees / Officers refusals. The threshold used to be 20% and the Government have reduced the target number. We know that the South East is targeted, driving to the coast is now awash with building. We will continue to resist where we can.

Earlier this month the Development Management and Enforcement Teams 'locked down' for a week to focus on clearing some of the backlog of planning cases which had built up, in order to create more space for existing work and more time to support staff.

A total of 143 planning decisions (approval or refusal) were taken and 41 enforcement cases were decided (either closed or taken forward for formal action). For comparison, figures for the week of 2 August 2021 were 51 and 1 respectively, with the weekly average for planning decisions being approximately 66.

Locally the areas that have been receiving truckloads of mud has stopped and enforcement are investigating the issues.

A simple request please; when popping your refuse bin outside for collection outside please put the handles facing the road. This is very helpful for our refuse collectors.

We still have some ward initiative fund to spare, so please get in touch if you feel you may be eligible.

At the time of writing, holiday decisions are fluid—so I cannot commit to a surgery date for this month.

ELSENHAM PARISH COUNCIL SEPTEMBER 2022

The Dandara planning application for 99 new houses on land off Isabel Drive and Stansted Road is on the agenda to be considered by Uttlesford District Council (UDC) Planning Committee on 28 September 2022.

At the same meeting UDC will be deciding on a recommendation to be sent to the Inspectorate for the planning application for 130 new houses on South of Henham Road. As the application went directly to PINS, UDC are only a consultee and can only give advice. If this application is approved; it would have a further impact on the roads in Elsenham. There is an additional aspect to this application, which is that this is Elsenham's last green space. The site is surrounded by several listed and historical buildings, the settings of which will be absolutely destroyed by the proposed development.

To fight against this application, Elsenham Parish Council is to engage a Planning and Transport Consultant to represent Elsenham Parish Council at the hearing.

Two telegraph poles cut in half have been installed either end of the public footpath that leads from Hailes Wood behind the houses to the old cricket ground. This route is very popular with residents but now people with buggies and some disabled people can no longer use it. This is a public footpath, and the issue has been reported to Essex County Council.

The lock on the pedestrian gate on the Smith Road allotments has disappeared. This is the second lock in two months that has gone missing, and it is very sad and disappointing that someone is doing this. Alternative ways of securing the allotments will be investigated.

Touchpoint is a food share for everyone to use, which is becoming very popular in Elsenham. It is run by volunteers who collect the food from supermarkets, using their own cars and petrol. Elsenham Parish Council is to give a grant of £150 to help them with their expenses.

The Parish Council has decided on which company to engage to refurbish the children's play area in the playing field. Once it is completed, hopefully, it will look wonderful and the children of Elsenham will have fun on the new equipment.

Airport parking is a great problem in the village and some residents have been asking for 'No Airport Parking' signs like the signs in Stansted. Essex County Cllr. Gooding said that these came from Manchester Airport. The residents of Stansted had given the signs a mixed response, as they are not enforceable. District Cllr. Le Count is looking into the problem of airport parking in the village.

The next Parish Council meeting will be Monday 3 October at 8pm in the Memorial Hall.

All residents are welcome.

DEVELOPMENT DEVELOPMENTS

The detailed application by Dandara for 99 homes at the west of the village, roughly half each off Isabel Drive and off Stansted Road, was due to be heard by Uttlesford District Council's Planning Committee on 28 September. Objections were expected to be made by the Parish Council. Proximity to the motorway means that acceptable noise levels cannot be achieved over all the site and there are not enough bungalows,

Outline approval of the scheme was granted at the end of 2020 on the basis that the developers will supply an additional traffic detector approaching Stansted from Elsenham, in order to reduce the queue on Grove Hill at peak times. This implausible solution will no doubt be used by other developers, including Countryside, whose application for 130 homes to the south of the Crown relies also on the usual models which are beloved of developers because they have no first-hand experience. Predictably, Countryside concludes that there will be no problem. As noted last month, the application will be determined by the Planning Inspectorate, since UDC has been 'designated' by Government on account of too many of its major decisions being overturned at appeal.

There is an argument to be made on heritage grounds against this application on account of the proximity of Elsenham Hall. Similarly, an objection can be made to a recent application for five houses in the grounds of the Old Vicarage in Hall Road because of the impact on the listed building. The access is well on the wrong side of acceptable - it is claimed that it is available already in the decaying form of an ancient farm gate, which has clearly been unused for some decades, or possibly centuries, and has been revealed only recently through the clearance of much undergrowth. Visibility from here onto Hall Road is remarkably poor.

Small developments are normally decided by a planning officer but, if there are good planning grounds for rejection, it can be 'called in' by a district councillor for determination by the Planning Committee. Such is the case with this application. The Parish Council has objected and at the same time made clear that, if it should be agreed, a reasonable contribution to a new Community Hall will be expected.

The Community Hall project has inched slightly closer to realisation with the signing, at long last, of the Section 106 agreement relating to the project to build 130 houses off Hall Road, on the site which wraps around the Old Vicarage. Half of £310,000 is to be paid before the commencement date, and the other half before half of the new homes are occupied. That's all very well as far as it goes, but there is nothing to say when the builders will finally move in.

The ongoing problem with housing applications is that UDC has no five-year housing land supply, and no immediate prospect of a Local Plan. Time is being spent investigating an anonymous proposal from a nameless developer, which might still come to nothing; and while UDC continues fiddle-faffing about, the district is wide open to applications which are difficult to defend.

Help is available if you are struggling to pay your bills

Firstly - check your benefit entitlements. You may be able to claim benefits or increase your current benefits if you are: of working age and on a low income, sick or disabled, of State Pension age and on a low income, a carer or responsible for children. You can use an online benefit calculator to check you are receiving all the benefits you are entitled to. You can find a link on our website. If you don't have internet access or need some extra help, our advisers can carry out a benefit check for you. Our contact details are at the top of this article.

Help from the government. The government will give every household in Great Britain £400 off their electricity bill. This is called the **Energy Bills Support Scheme**. You don't need to do anything to get the money and you won't have to pay it back. (You'll get the £400 in 6 instalments starting from October 2022. £66 in October and November and £67 in December, January, February and March). If you have an electricity meter and pay your bills every month or quarterly, your supplier will automatically take the amounts off your energy bill each month. If you have a prepayment meter, your supplier will confirm how you'll get the £400. They'll either automatically add the instalments to your energy meter or give you the instalments as vouchers by email, text or post.

Cost of Living Payment. If you get benefits based on your income, the government will give you a £326 'Cost of Living Payment'. If you get Working or Child Tax Credit, you'll get your Cost of Living Payment in autumn 2022. If you get another benefit, you'll get your Cost of Living Payment on or after 14 July 2022. You'll only get 1 Cost of Living Payment - even if you're claiming more than one benefit. To get this payment you must have either:

- been getting a benefit payment on or between 26 April and 25 May 2022 it doesn't matter if it gets paid to someone else, like your landlord
- started a successful benefit claim by 25 May 2022 or by 26 April 2022 if you're applying for Universal Credit.

The government have said they'll send a second Cost of Living Payment in 2022. If you get Working or Child Tax Credit, you'll get your second payment in winter. If you get other benefits, you'll get your second payment in autumn.

If you're not claiming any benefits, you should check if you can claim. It's worth starting a claim as soon as possible if you're eligible - this means you might be able to get the second Cost of Living Payment.

Help from your local Council. Uttlesford households in Council Tax bands A-D will receive a £150 rebate in their council tax bill this year to help with the rising cost of living. This does not have to be repaid. Payment will be made directly by UDC – how you will be paid depends on how you pay your bill. Take responsibility – that's the plea to drivers, their families and friends and members of the public from Essex Police

Essex Police deals with drink driving robustly 365 days a year but will be stepping up road checks in towns across the county with bustling night time economies and rural areas where some drivers believe they have less chance of getting caught drunk behind the wheel.

As well as breath tests, police officers will be testing drivers for drug use with road side impairment tests and targeting those who use the road to commit other types of crime.

Essex Police is asking everyone to take responsibility by:

- •Stopping family and friends getting behind the wheel if they have had an alcoholic drink
- Dialling 999 if you know someone is drunk and you see them getting behind the wheel of a car
- •Calling Essex Police on

 0300 333 4444 to give police information about someone who regularly chooses to drink and drive Telling Crimestoppers anonymously about people who regularly choose to drink and drive by calling

 0800 555 111 or visiting: www.crimestoppers-uk.org

"It's time we all took responsibility. Don't let friends or family get behind the wheel of a car if you know they've had a drink and report drink drivers to Essex Police or Crimestoppers. Picking up the phone could save a life. Just one drink is too many when driving. One or two isn't okay regardless of your age, sex or build so if you're planning a night out designate a driver who will stick to soft drinks."

"Think about the consequences of drink driving. Losing your licence could mean losing your job and leave you unable to pay your mortgage or rent. More seriously, you could face imprisonment and the prospect of having to live with the guilt of taking a life for the rest of yours."

The regional manager for Crimestoppers, said: Crimestoppers received over 100 calls about drink drivers in Essex, indicating that this is a real concern. If someone has information about a regular drink driver, they may feel uncomfortable about going to the police. Crimestoppers can take this information 100% anonymously. We do not ask for the caller's name or any personal details. We do not trace or record our calls and those giving information do not have to give a statement to the Police or go to court. Nobody will know you called."

"In all the years we have been running Crimestoppers has never broken its promise of anonymity".

Thought For The Month by Louis Wilson

Hello everyone! On behalf of all the Wilsons, please can I give our sincere thanks for the very warm welcome which we have received since moving to the benefice in August.

Thank you especially to everyone who helped make the licensing service on 5 September such a memorable occasion.

It's been a bit of a whirlwind (finishing in Sussex, moving house, family holiday in France) but we are delighted to be here. In the midst of everything, I thought I would prepare by re-reading a biography of J. Hudson Taylor, the founder of the China Inland Mission (renamed OMF 86 years later).

Let me tell you why. In the 19th century, inland China was practically unknown. The population was roughly 350 million and essentially there was no Chinese church. Hudson Taylor arrived in 1854 without church organisation backing and no obvious qualification for the task.

What he did have was utter confidence in the Gospel of Jesus Christ and in God's sovereign provision (one of his favourite sayings was 'Depend upon it, GOD'S work done in GOD'S way will never lack GOD'S supplies'), plus the most profound compassion for the teeming millions of Chinese who were dying without Christ.

He learned Chinese and out of the highest respect for Chinese culture adopted Chinese hairstyle and clothing. This attracted much criticism, but Hudson Taylor was well ahead of his time. His ambition, he said, was to see Chinese Christians, true Christians but Chinese in every sense of the word, led by Chinese pastors, worshipping in the costume of their fathers, in their own tongue and their own buildings.

He was a consummate doer and a consummate pray-er. His son later said, "He prayed as if everything depended upon the praying... but he worked also, as though everything depended upon the working."

It seems to me that these are abiding principles for all Christian ministry today. Hudson Taylor was thoroughly biblical and Christ-centred, yet ready to change, adapt and experiment in order, like Paul, to "become all things to all people so that by all means possible I might save some (1 Cor. 9: 22)."

But what is most striking is how this very ordinary man patiently endured such extraordinary setbacks and privations for the sake of the Gospel. In 1869, when he had already buried four of his children in the soil of China, his wife Maria became ill and died.

It was personal suffering of a level inconceivable to most of us (certainly to me), yet he was able to kneel by her bed and pray: "Dear God, thank you for giving my darling Maria to me. Thank you for the 12 and a half years of happiness we have had together. Thank you for taking her to your own blessed presence. I dedicate myself anew to your service. Amen."

When he himself died his headstone inscription, still preserved in the city of Zhenjiang, said: "Sacred to the memory of Rev. J Hudson Taylor, the revered founder of the China Inland Mission, born 1832, died 1905. A man in Christ."

A man in Christ. What a remarkable summary of a man's life. And what a great reminder of the priorities to look for in Christian ministry. I do look forward to meeting many of you in the months and years to come.

As I was putting these notes together I heard of the death of our Queen of seventy years.

NATURAL OUTLOOK

Well the drought ended with a "bang" in September but this month can be very wet with "named " storms, a warm patch up to 24°C, cold ones down to 2°C and a frost. Whether we get the early autumn as predicted remains to be seen.



We can expect to see more blackbirds and brilliantly coloured jays as they join us from the Continent, especially as the oak trees bear a heavy set of acorns - jays' favourite. Look out for them on Station Road, on oaks by Broom Farm, Ridley Gardens and on DeMandeville Green. In Station Road there is a very tall silver birch in Alcuin's garden on which I have seen about forty goldfinches feeding on the birch seeds and a 'murmuration' of starlings chattering and doing likewise. Apart from robins, the only birdsong I have heard was a blackbird's in Golds Business Park warbling under a lamp light.

On quiet days on the playing field, the magpie family collects, adults and juveniles, and also up to ten pied wagtails, some crows and even flocks of wintering seagulls but not so often as before because we use the ground more frequently. Not so long ago we had no resident red kites, now often seen drifting around over Stansted Road, Isabel Drive, The Spinney and the playing field – 'he' was there keeping an eye on us over the Fete. And there were reports of a pair checking out the Canada Goose goslings on the golf course.

By mid-October, fieldfares and redwings are here for the season in local fields and at Hatfield Forest for instance. Redwings can be mistaken for song thrushes but they are more sociable, have a thick white eye stripe, and a red-orange patch on their wings and flanks. Fieldfares are about the same size as mistle thrushes and have a range of gentle colours from silvery grey, blue/grey, shades of chestnut brown on the upper parts, and a much speckled breast on yellow buff. They usually arrive and feed in flocks but for several years we had a 'lone' one to be seen sitting atop a pear tree on DeMandeville Green or occasionally in our back garden.

During the first half of the month mostly, I have recorded a few remaining butterflies, large whites, small tortoiseshells, red admirals, a comma and a large yellow underwing moth by the porch light. Also bees are still about on flowers such as Michaelmas daisies and anything left in bloom.

Some trees keep their leaves green this month but we get a variety of colours now; the ornamental ashes in a car park at Thorley turn purple, other ashes go lime yellow, we get deep red from dogwoods, shades of green, butter yellow and orange from field maple, a beige from oaks and my spindle goes red and purple.

Local mammals to be seen in daylight or dark are bank vole, grey squirrel, fox, hedgehog, muntjac and fallow deer. So drive carefully.



This recipe is one that has been shared with many over the years. I make no apology for repeating it now.

FLORENTINE SLICES (Makes 12 to 16)

8 oz (225g) dark chocolate, broken into pieces

2 oz (50g) butter or margarine

4 oz (100g) demerara sugar

2 eggs beaten

2 oz (50g) mixed dried fruit

4 oz (100g) coconut

2 oz (50g) quartered glacé cherries

Put chocolate in bowl and melt carefully over hot water. Grease and line a 7½ inch (19cm) square cake tin. Spread the melted chocolate all over the base of the tin and leave to set.

Meanwhile, cream together butter and sugar until mixture is light and fluffy. Beat in the eggs thoroughly. Mix together remaining ingredients and add to creamed mixture. Spoon into the tin and spread over the set chocolate.

Bake in centre of cool oven (150°C/fan 130°C/gas Mark 2) for 45 minutes, until golden brown. Remove from oven and leave until quite cold. Carefully mark into

12 or 16 squares with sharp knife, then loosen with palette knife and lift each square carefully from tin.

CHEF'S RECOMMENDATIONS:

After cooking and cooling the florentines, put the tin in the refrigerator until really cold. This way, the slices will come out without any trouble. Try sultanas, raisins, cranberries or any chopped dried fruit (dried apricots work well) instead of mixed dried fruit. As an alternative to glacé cherries, you could use chopped mixed peel. Best kept in the fridge while the weather is warm.

THE GIVER OF STARS by Jojo Moyes Reviewed by Marion Giles for Elsenham Book Group

'Alice Wright doesn't love her new American husband. Nor her domineering father-in-law or the judgmental townsfolk of Baileyville, Kentucky.

Stifled and misunderstood, she yearns for escape and finds it in defiant Margery O'Hare and the sisterhood bringing books to the isolated and vulnerable. But when her father-in-law and the town turn against them, Alice fears the freedom, friendship and the new love she's found will be lost 'So says the blurb on the back of the book.



'Misfit women rule in a beguiling tale of unlikely love. Moyes writes with warmth and intelligence . . . the most appealing thing about The Giver of Stars, however, is her wonderful way with romance. Delightful.' *The Times*

This was the choice of the book group this month.

In 1937, a small mining town gets a grant for a town library from an initiative by Eleanor Roosevelt . The community is quite spread out and many dwellings are remote so books have to be delivered by horseback.

The book starts off slowly as we are introduced to the characters. There are two main characters. Alice, an English woman who marries the son of the owner of the coal mines in this town. She becomes stuck in a loveless marriage with an indifferent husband and a bully for a father-in-law. Her family back in England is reluctant for her to admit her mistake and return to England so she stays. The second is Margery. Her father was a wife and child beating drunk who made and sold local Moonshine. Although none of her family remains alive, memories of her father's behaviour are strong among the townsfolk and many in the town view her negatively. The fact that she is a strong woman who knows and speaks her mind does not help.

Margery, is a good horsewoman, and knows the area well so is a natural to run the library. She recruits women who can ride to help with delivering the books. Alice volunteers and becomes one of the women known as the Packhorse Library. Her family is opposed to her actions which worsens the situation at home as the expectation for women was to keep house and have babies. However, the library thrives and is loved by women who suddenly have access to books, education and information.

The Packhorse Library was real. The story and romantic elements are fictional. There are many strands woven into the story: racism, domestic violence, unfair working practices, prejudice, tragedy and oppression. However, there is also a happy ending with marriage, babies and a resolution.
